### FOOTBALL ROUND UP

WOW!! This has got to be the biggest week in football in KISU history. On Saturday we had a weekend of matches at ISU with four of the KISU teams in action.

The first game saw our junior 7&U mixed team continue on their winning way with a fantastic 5-1 win over Aga Khan. For KISU Chris was once again the top goal scorer with great efforts from Samantha, Nina, Max, Omeed, Jeremie, David and Marvin.

Our 11 boys A and B both played 2 games with mixed results for both teams. KISU B played a great match against Frambosoli and were ahead 2-0 at half time after 2 goals from Kanen. The boys from Frambosoli came back with 2 goals of their own in the second half to draw the game. In the second game the boys put in a grand fighting display in going down 4-1 to a very skilful Aga Khan side. The KISU A boys played the same teams with similar results. They found the going tough against Aga Khan and went down 4-0. In the second game against Frambosoli a goal from Ali made the difference to give KISU a solid 1-0 victory.

The 11&U girls were the last to play on Saturday and put in a very polished effort to finish with a 3-0 win over Ambrosoli.
