## SCHOOL DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

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It is with regret that I have to inform you that two of our secondary teachers, Mr. Halter and Miss O'Hare, have informed us that they do not intend to return to work this term. This, of course, is entirely unprofessional behavior on their part, that shows little or no regard for the well-being of our students. I have informed Search Associates, the recruitment agency from whom we employed them, of my considerable disappointment that they should recommend to us candidates who would behave in such a way and am awaiting their reply.

In the meantime, let me assure you that plans to cover the lessons of the two teachers are already afoot and, with Year 11 and DP2 classes now drawing to a conclusion, it seems clear already that we can manage very well, though obviously there will be an additional strain on a number of us for the remainder of the term, as a result. My apologies to those of you whose children have been affected but I hope you will agree that this is a robust response from the school that involves subject specialist replacements (I am an English teacher by trade) to ensure the best possible learning continues.

Finally, I recognize that I must take some of the responsibility myself for this situation, as it is me who leads the recruitment process. We review candidates very thoroughly, often reading 5 or 6 references about them and assessing them very carefully throughout the course of interviews that often last an hour, usually led by myself and the relevant school Head. However, recruitment, as many of you will know in your own work contexts, is not an exact science. If we make new appointments before the end of the term, we will update you at that time.

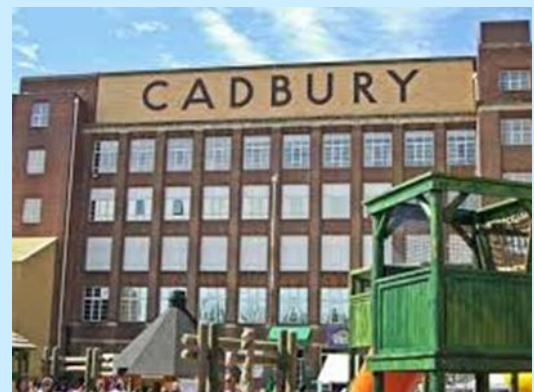

### **Secondary Music Recital**

The Secondary music recital is scheduled for 17th May 2018 starting at 5.30pm. The program will feature all secondary students involved in the private music program and all those that are being prepared for the forthcoming ABRSM Examinations due to take place the following month. Students will perform individually on a variety of musical instruments including voice, piano, violin, flute, guitar, recorder, trombone, clarinet and drums. Everyone is welcome.

### **Music Night**

Our end of year music night is scheduled for Wednesday 20 June starting at 6pm in the School Auditorium. The program will feature all secondary students in Key Stage 3 and those that do music at Key Stage 4. More details will follow.

### **Instrumental Music Lesson**

KISU runs a Private Music Lessons program for all age-groups where students seeking to improve their playing or singing ability have the option of taking individual private lessons for an additional fee. Approximately 10 professional musicians from around Kampala offer intensive weekly instruction in voice, keyboard, wind, string, and percussion instruments. Students may study voice, piano, classical guitar, electric guitar, bass guitar, modern drums, African drums, cornet, recorder, violin, clarinet, saxophone, trumpet and African Xylophone.

Registration is in progress now and forms can be obtained from the Music Department. The cost per lesson is UGSHS 35,000 and a minimum of 10 lessons paid in advance is required at registration.
